

ABOUT BOOK BUCKS

What is Book Bucks?

It is a reading program that pays you “bucks” for what you read, whether you read it for class, or for your own enjoyment. This includes any books, or magazines/newspaper articles read between July 1st and the following February.

Who may participate?

All Dake students.

How do I earn book bucks?

After reading a book, or a magazine/newspaper article, pick up a book bucks form in the library, or in your ELA classroom. Complete ONE form for each book/article you read, and turn it in to Ms. Bayerl, the Dake librarian. (100 pages = 1 book buck)

What do I do with my book bucks?

An auction will be held in the all-purpose room at Dake in March. Thousands of items will be auctioned off ranging in value from \$1.00 to \$500.00.

When do I get my bucks?

The physical book bucks are handed out the morning of the auction. When you turn in your first book bucks form, a book buck’s bank account is opened up for you. We keep track of every page you read!

Where do the prizes come from?

Prizes come from a variety of sources. The money raised at the library book fair is used toward book bucks, however, most of the items are donated by Dake staff, local businesses, and parents. West Irondequoit is a community of very generous people who place a high value on reading!

Students must earn a minimum of 10 book bucks throughout the year in order to attend the auction in March.

There are monthly deadlines for turning in book bucks. Students need to check the deadlines regularly. They are posted in the library and in all English classrooms.
